CARERS RIGHTS DAY

This year, Carers Rights Day was on Thursday 21 November 2024 this year's theme was recognising your rights.

Every day, 12,000 people become unpaid carers for a partner, family member or a friend – many of whom don't see themselves as carers, often unaware of their legal rights and what they're entitled to in terms of support and benefits. The latest Census shows that in the Western Isles over 13% of the population are providing unpaid care.

This year's theme is 'recognising your rights' –the aim is to help carers recognise and understand their rights, and to access the support available to them, whenever they need it.

As a carer, knowing your rights empowers you with information about what you're entitled to. This helps you feel confident asking for what you need, as well as challenging things when your rights are not being met – whether that be in the workplace or education, in accessing health or social care, or when interacting with other professionals or at home.

What are your rights?

• The right to a Carer's Assessment

- The Right to Unpaid Carer's Leave
- The right to request flexible working
- To be able to request a free flu jab
- The right to ask your GP Practice to identify you as a carer
- To be consulted with when the person you are caring for is being discharged from hospital

Do you have unwanted Community Equipment?

The Community Equipment Service (CES) is appealing to the public to return any unused or unwanted items. The service can collect, sanitise and repair CES supplied equipment in preparation for future use and by returning the equipment, you're not only helping other people in your community, but helping reduce our impact on the planet.

Examples of the equipment they are looking for is shown below:

- Commodes (Wheeled & Static Commodes)
- Household Aids (Wheeled Trolleys, Kitchen Aids, Perching Stool)
- Toilet Aids (Toilet Frames & Raised Toilet Seats)
- Furniture Raisers (for Beds, Chairs and Settees)
- Bathing Aids (Bath lifts, Bath boards, Shower Stools, Shower Chairs)
- Bed Aids (Mattress Elevators, Backrests, Bedrails, Profiling Beds)
- Pressure Aids (Cushions & Mattresses)
- Mobility Aids (Walking Frames, Sticks, Crutches)
- Hoists, Slings, Slide Sheets





Carers Support Payment

Carer's Allowance, paid by the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), is being replaced by Carer Support Payment paid by Social Security Scotland.

The transfer from Carer's Allowance to Carer Support Payment will happen gradually with all awards expected to be transferred by Spring 2025.

People do not need to do anything as their award will transfer automatically. The amount they receive will not change. Both the DWP and Social Security Scotland will write to people in advance to let them know that their award will be transferring. Carers should continue to report any changes in their circumstances to the DWP until they receive a letter from Social Security Scotland telling them their award has transferred.

Carer Support Payment provides £81.90 a week to eligible carers.

The benefit is available to new applicants in the Western Isles, as it is one of 4 pilot areas.

Unpaid carers and young carers are eligible for the flu vaccine

The flu virus spreads more easily during the colder months as we spend more time indoors with others. That's why all unpaid carers and young carers are being offered the flu vaccine this year, to help protect themselves and the people they care for.
